2017 SUMMER ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION POSITION AT IOWA LAKESIDE LABORATORY

Do you have a fascination for nature? Do you enjoy sharing it with others? Are you working on developing teaching, communication and/or interpretative skills, or exploring career options in environmental sciences and/or conservation fields? Then the lowa Lakeside Laboratory's Summer Environmental Education Position may be just for you!

DUTIES

Create, conduct, assist and implement Lakeside's summer science outreach programs for learners of all ages, including family and adult programs, science/nature camps for pre-K through middle school students, and volunteer programs. DESCRIPTION AND QUALIFICATIONS

The 12 week, paid position is for college level students or recent graduates with background in natural sciences and/or education. Applicants should have a passion for nature and learning, and a desire to share that with others. Confidence in public speaking with learners of all ages, good communication skills, and familiarity with best science practices are also important assets to this position.

DATES AND COMPENSATION

The paid position runs mid-May through the first week of August with start/end dates somewhat flexible. Meals and lodging at lowa Lakeside Laboratory is included, and compensation is \$10.00/hour. The opportunity to live and work on the 140-acre Lakeside campus and nature preserve as well as to interact with Lakeside students, faculty, researchers, and writer/artists in residence are added bonuses to this position.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Applications will be accepted through March 15.

HOW TO APPLY

Interested applicants should pick one of the Wild Wednesday (summer public program) topics listed on the Lakeside website and write a one-page description of how you would implement the topic into a one-hour, hands-on learning experience for a public audience of approximately 30 people ages seven to adult. The description will be evaluated based on how it includes opportunity for participants to express inquiry and engage in hands-on learning. Additionally, applicants should send a resume and names of two references - at least one of which should be a faculty member in your field - and to Jane-shuttleworth@uiowa.edu by March 15.
